Creative Curriculum

In our Junior School a Creative Curriculum inspires an intrinsic love of learning; building confidence, critical thinking, creativity and compassion, alongside growing knowledge and skills.

St Mary's education

Our students are known and cherished by our teachers, many of whom are graduates of Oxford, Cambridge and leading London universities. All are passionate about their subjects.

We encourage and inspire each girl, focusing on nurturing their natural talents and interests – across a broad, engaging curriculum.

Learning experience

In the classroom, we tailor our approach to suit students' preferred learning styles. Lessons are interactive and collaborative, and students form strong, mutually respectful working relationships with their peers and their teachers.

Students experience a variety of methods – from teacher-led discussion, group work and independent study. Technology enhances learning and girls use Chromebooks, with pre-approved apps to collaborate and engage with their studies.

Homework is meaningful, with teachers available before and after school, or at morning break and lunchtime to support girls in their work. Boarders complete their homework with support at Mary Ward House, at the end of the school day.

Discover new talents

At every stage, we offer opportunities to extend learning and broaden horizons. This includes a variety of extra-curricular clubs, workshops, visits and residential trips, and academic enrichment activities including guest speakers and national level competitions.

Make a difference

School life is full of opportunities in leadership, service and enterprise. These provide different ways to make positive changes in the world, and enable our girls to realise the power they have to stand up for what they believe in.



Excel in sport

We encourage all our girls to lead healthy, active lives and sport is integral to our curriculum. In partnership with **Homerton College, University of Cambridge** our ambitious Long Road sports facilities include: two AstroTurf pitches, netball and tennis courts, athletics track, cricket green and field facilities, plus a pavilion with physio room, kitchen and changing rooms.

In partnership with **Homerton College** and the **City of Cambridge Rowing Club**, we have a boathouse on the River Cam, which enables our girls to enjoy rowing during the week and at weekends.

Support for international students



Outstanding EAL provision at no additional cost

Girls may be supported in-class by a Learning Support Assistant, or through individual or group support. All progress is carefully monitored and communicated regularly and clearly with students and parents.

English language tuition

English as an Additional Language (EAL)

EAL provision is embedded in our curriculum, at no additional cost to parents. EAL lessons develop English vocabulary and grammar, as well as improving reading, writing, speaking and listening skills.

- 6 x EAL lessons every two weeks Year 7 to 9
- 7 x EAL lessons every two weeks Year 10 and 11
- 5 x EAL lessons every two weeks Year 12 and 13

English Language Support (ELS)

ELS lessons can be taken in place of one Modern Foreign Language throughout Senior School. These tailored lessons enable girls to develop language skills which support learning in other subjects and provide a valuable foundation for progressing to GCSE level study in Years 10 and 11.

EAL qualifications

Girls can also prepare for internationally recognised EAL qualifications.

- Year 10: Cambridge English: First
- Year 11: Cambridge English: Advanced

Sixth Form

International students joining in Sixth Form, or those who wish to improve on their current EAL grades, take the IELTS qualification in Year 12 or Year 13. This ensures it is valid for UK visa purposes when students embark on university studies. IELTS meets the English language requirements for English-medium university courses throughout the world.

Independent schools

St Mary's School, Cambridge is an independent school (also known as a 'public school' or 'private school'). We are 'independent' of government control, which brings many advantages, including freedom to offer an innovative curriculum, significantly smaller class sizes and a broader choice of subjects.

Boarders and day students

Some independent schools offer day or boarding provision only. We have a mixture of day and boarding students, which creates a diverse

school community, enriched by different perspectives from all around the world. Day students return home to their families at the end of each school day; boarders return to our boarding house, Mary Ward House.

Co-education and single-sex schools

As a single-sex school, we excel at educating girls. In the UK, single-sex education has a reputation for academic excellence and our girls experience an environment tailored to their specific needs, in which they pursue their talents free of gender stereotypes. Co-educational schools educate girls and boys together.

Student numbers

The average UK independent school has c.400 students. At St Mary's, we have c.650 students, perfect for offering a breadth of experience, but small enough to support exceptional pastoral care and ensure each individual girl is known.

International students join us at different times; many choose to join our Junior School before going on to complete their GCSEs and A Levels to benefit from the whole St Mary's experience.

Junior School (age 4-11)

Situated in Chaucer Road, our Junior School offers a dynamic learning environment and inspiring teaching in a tranquil and safe location. We provide a Creative Curriculum, which encourages girls to develop into creative, critical and reflective learners – as we nurture a love of learning that lasts a lifetime.

Our curriculum uses a blended approach, where topics and themes are explored through different subject areas. Core subjects are connected across the curriculum, enabling pupils to gain a broader academic understanding of how, and why, their learning is relevant to them.

Early Years (up to age 5; Reception class)

We lay key foundations for routines that support effective learning and develop key skills through practice, discussion and reflection. Girls gain responsibility, self-discipline and independence in readiness for the future.

Pre-Prep (age 5-7; Years 1 and 2)

A focus on English, Mathematics, Science and Computer Science, balanced by Art, Geography, History, Religious Education and Personal, Health and Social Education (PSHE).

Prep (age 7-11; Years 3 to 6)

Core subjects of English, Mathematics, Science and Computer Science are connected with other subjects, as girls start to develop their preferred individual learning styles.

Senior School (age 11-16)

Our Senior School on Bateman Street is partially set in the historic and characterful family homes of The Elms and Paston House, as well as in our Art and Photography Centre, innovative Science Hub and vibrant Drama Studios. Girls also benefit from our ambitious sports developments at Long Road and on the River Cam.

Girls from Year 5 to 13 live together, creating a second family, led and supported by a team of dedicated, caring staff.

Our experienced team excel at helping each girl to quickly feel at home. We offer exceptional pastoral care: the safety, well-being and happiness of all our boarders is our first priority.

Mary Ward House is filled with fun, friendship and laughter; whilst allowing for privacy and quiet moments when needed. We offer beautifully furnished facilities, with comfortable bedrooms and spacious communal areas.

Located in a quiet, safe residential area within easy walking distance of our schools, Mary Ward House is a beautiful, three-storey property, set in substantial grounds. It accommodates 90+ students, plus our team of boarding staff who live in, caring for the girls before school, each evening and at weekends.

Life as a boarder

Week days

Our week day routine ensures girls find a healthy balance of academic study and leisure time.

🕒 7.00am	Girls are woken up by a Sixth Form student
🕒 7.15-7.45am	Breakfast
🕒 8.30am	Join day students for registration
🕒 4.00pm	School day ends. Free time and a light snack at Mary Ward House
🕒 4.30-5.30pm	Supervised, supported homework for Years 5 and 6
🕒 4.45-5.30pm	Years 7 to 9 attend a structured activity. This can be a boarding activity or an after-school club. Older students can opt to start on homework, or to attend extra-curricular activities.
🕒 6.00pm	Dinner for all
🕒 7.15-8.30pm	Supervised, supported homework for Years 7 to 9

Weekends

Weekends have a more relaxed feel. Girls can enjoy an early breakfast of fruit, cereal and toast, and a cooked brunch is served between 11am and 12 noon before afternoon activities and a more formal meal in the evening. Boarders in Year 7 to 9 complete their homework in a supported session on Saturday morning.

Medical care



All boarders are registered with the School Medical Officer who runs a weekly clinic and can treat sickness and prescribe medicines and treatment as necessary. Our School Nurses are available daily to assist students in our on-site Medical Centre, between 8.00am-4.00pm. Outside these hours our boarding staff hold first-aid qualifications and are trained to administer medication. Emergencies are treated at Addenbrooke's Hospital, a centre of excellence.



Keeping in touch

We encourage girls to stay in close contact with family and friends. Building a partnership with parents is crucial to us and boarding staff are regularly in touch with parents and guardians.



International Food Fair

At this popular annual event boarders and day girls share the cuisine of their home countries.

A healthy, balanced lifestyle

Our girls have a balanced diet, packed with nutrients, to keep them healthy and provide the energy they need to function at their best.

We provide delicious food across a wide variety of hot dishes, salads and fruit, plus access to regular snacks and drinks. All our food is labelled, and care is taken to cater for students with medical or religious dietary needs wherever possible. Boarders are expected to attend all weekday meals and a register is taken.

Week days: Breakfast, lunch, tea and dinner are provided, plus a breacktime snack.

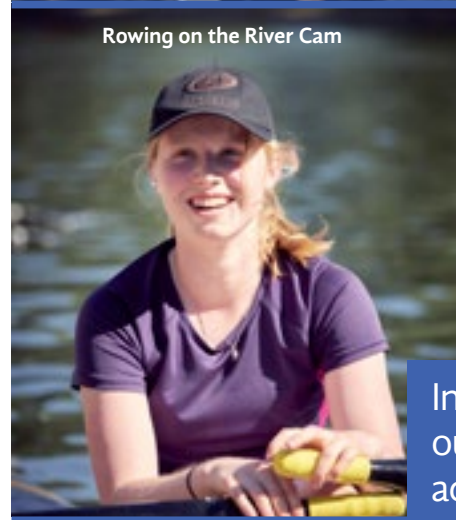

Keeping busy

Craft sessions, dance and cookery classes, plus regular trips to enjoy punting, bowling, the cinema or theatre are just a few of our organised activities which keep girls busy outside school hours. At weekends, we travel further afield with adventures including visits to London museums and galleries, Manchester and the Harry Potter Studios.



Boarding options

From Year 5, age 9, international students can board on either a full-time or weekly basis.

Full time boarders

Full boarders return home for half term and school holidays. Most of our boarders are full time and therefore are in school during weekends in term time.

Weekly boarders

Weekly boarders go home at the end of each school week, returning on a Sunday evening or Monday morning.

Tier 4 Sponsorship

We are licensed as a Tier 4 Sponsor by UK Visas and Immigration and offer sponsorship for child student visas for our full time boarders.

Boarding FAQs

Guardianship

Boarders without a family member in the UK require a guardian in the UK. For assistance in selecting a guardian, we recommend using AEGIS. Families must ensure guardianship is in place before girls arrive at St Mary's.

Guardians have to live within 75 miles of St Mary's School and be able to come to St Mary's School at short notice, if necessary. They must be able to host the student in school holidays, or in exceptional circumstances such as illness. Guardians also play a vital role in communicating effectively between parents, school and the student, including attending parents' evenings and other key events.

Exeat weekends

We do not have Exeat weekends. However, boarders can arrange to visit their guardians or go home at the weekend, providing written permission is given to the Housemistress at least 48 hours in advance.

Do boarders have their own rooms?

Year 5 to Year 9 boarders share a room with four or five other girls, girls in Year 10 to Lower Sixth usually share a room with one other student, with Upper Sixth students having single study bedrooms.

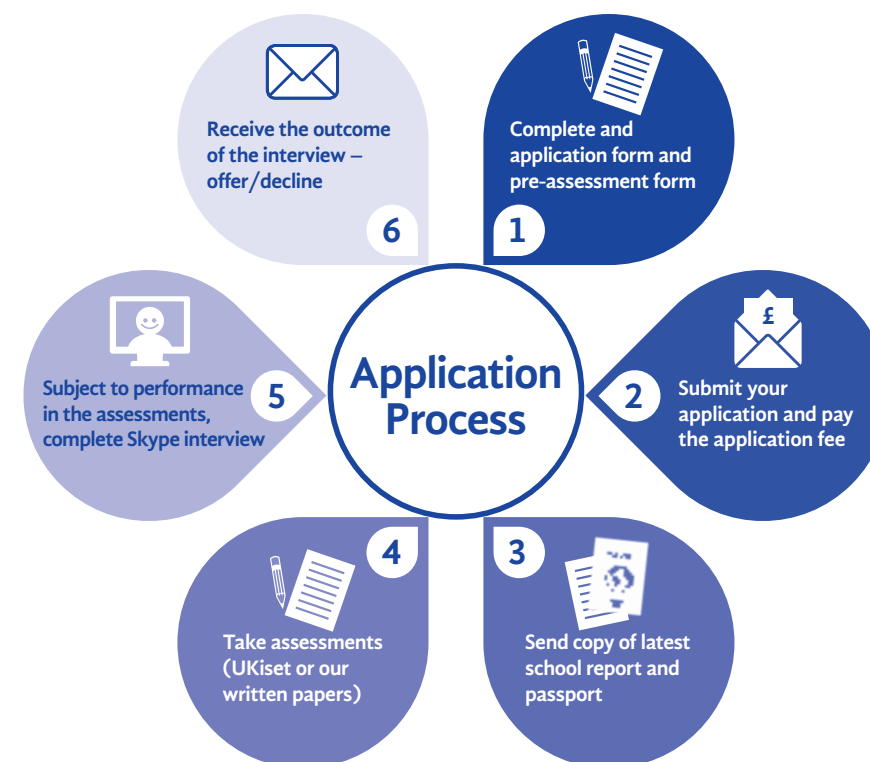

How to apply

We welcome both **direct applications** to our admissions team or applications made via an **educational agent**. We accept applications to **all year groups** (except Year 11 and 13).

Demand for our boarding places is very high, therefore we recommend that you apply as early as possible: **at least 12 months** before your desired start date.

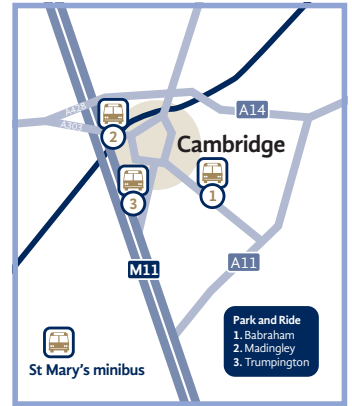
