EXTENDED PROJECT QUALIFICATION (EPQ)

Alongside A Levels, St Mary's girls build a breadth of knowledge, skills and experience, with many completing an Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) worth up to 70 UCAS points.

EPQ themes

The EPQ offers students the freedom to study a topic of their choice in order to produce a research report, production or artefact.

As always, our EPQ themes reflect the individuality and creativity of our students. Our 2023 topics ranged from researching the extent that large food retailers can help solve the food waste crisis, the potential effects of the ten-year fishing ban on biodiversity in the Yangtze River, and a book that explores the extent that female victims of domestic violence face injustices in the legal system to a dissertation on the evolution of pizza throughout history.

Classical Civilisation
