

Everyone benefits from the expertise of our Learning Support department, which provides advice for all teachers on how best to support our students.





Through our extra- and co-curricular activities and trips, your daughter will discover her best and truest self, gaining the confidence to express who she really is.





Mary Ward House provides a delightful and welcoming home-from-home, just a five minute walk from our schools, with stunning views across Cambridge University Botanic Garden.


Boarders from Year 5 to 13 live together, creating a second family, led and supported by a team of dedicated, caring staff.






